WIGGLE WHILE YOU WORK

SING ALONG: "Flea, Fly, Mosquito"

Start the music and join the children's voices that echo the adult's voice. Soon enough, you'll be able to chant and sing the lyrics in a back-and-forth way without musical accompaniment. What a great way to set the mood as you work on your critter art!





Colorful Caterpillar What you'll need:

- Sturdy piece of paper with 7 circles drawn on it
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Metal paper fasteners
- Markers, crayons, or paint

What you'll do:

- Use markers, crayons, or paint to decorate the circles (don't forget the caterpillar's face!).
- Cut out all of the caterpillar circles.
- Punch holes in the pieces as indicated by the black dots.
- Connect the pieces as indicated by the black dots.

Costumes are a great way to bring your little one's imagination to life. Look in your Halloween stockpile to see if you have any bugs, critter or fairy costumes on hand. If not, get creative! You'll be amazed what paper bags and face paint can do to transform your child into a fun creepy crawlie friend. LET IMAGINATIONS CRAWL

Dangling Spider What you'll need:

- Pom poms
- Googly eyes
- Or, a piece of paper (to draw spider face)
- Paper plate
- Scissors

- Hole punch
- Glue or tape
- String or yarn
- Markers, crayons, or paint
- 8 pipe cleaners

What you'll do:

- Cut a large hole in the center of the plate.
- Punch holes around the outer edge of the plate and thread string to create a web.
- Use pom poms and googly eyes to create a spider face, or cut a paper circle and decorate a spider face with markers and crayons.
- Attach pipe cleaner legs from body to edge of plate with glue or tape.
- Tie a string into a loop from one of the holes at the top of your web.
- Hang your spider anywhere you like!

LITTLE CRITTERS HOME ACTIVITIES

Have you worked up an appetite yet? It's time to make some tasty critter snacks! Choose from something sweet or something savory...let your little chef decide! As you prepare a snack, enjoy listening to the Kindermusik version of the classic, "The Ants Go Marching." SERVE UP SOME GRUB

Worms in Dirt What you'll need:

- 2 cups milk
- 1 package instant chocolate pudding
- 8 ounces frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 1/2 cups sandwich cookies, crushed
- Gummy worms & plastic cups

What you'll do:

- Whisk together milk and pudding until completely dissolved. Let stand 5 minutes.
- Stir in whipped topping and ½ of the crushed cookies.
- Put this mixture into cups.
- Top with the other ½ of the cookies.
- Add gummy worms on top and enjoy!

Ants on a Log What you'll need:

- Celery
- Peanut butter or cream cheese
- Raisins or other dried fruit

What you'll do:

- Fill celery stalks with your choice of creamy spread.
- Add the raisins as "ants."

Fingerplays like "Eensy Weensy
Spider" are more than just a fun
way to engage with a little one.
They're a brain boosting activity!
Motions that involve both hands are
doubly beneficial, as moving the two
sides of the body activates the two
hemispheres of the brain. The more

more learning occurs.
